

WELCOME TO THE NORTH MAINE WOODS PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOP!

To help make your trip an even more enjoyable adventure, we have compiled a list of suggestions and recommendations:

Personal Gear

- Weather: Due to the possibility of rain and bad weather conditions, we suggest you bring suitable waterproof clothing i.e.: two piece rain suit or poncho. We also recommend waterproof footwear such as waterproof hiking boots and / or rubber boots as well. We will still go out each day regardless of weather conditions.
- Bring extra changes of clothing. We will lend each participant a mesh material bug jacket (Black flies will be out) to use during the workshop. Temperatures in June in the North Country can be unpredictable, so we recommend thin, long sleeve synthetic material shirts and long legged comfortable pants. Don't forget a jacket for those cool early mornings. It also could be quite warm, so plan to dress in layers.
- Bring along your personal items such as tissue, lip balm, sunscreen, bug dope, sunglasses, hats, container for drinking water, etc.

Camera & Equipment Gear

- Please bring your particular camera's manual with you and have it accessible during the workshop. We will not necessarily know the inner workings of your particular camera model should a problem or question arise.
- Be familiar with your camera's settings before the workshop – this will assure a more productive and proficient workshop for you. Knowing before the workshop how to bring up your camera's histogram and adjusting your camera's exposure compensation will be helpful.
- Bring along some means of supporting your camera such as a tripod (highly recommended) or monopod. Many times we will be photographing in the low light levels of sunrise or early evening and you will definitely need some sort of support for your camera.
- Bring plenty of film or memory cards (or storage devices)! It is easy to run out during this workshop! For the most part, an extreme telephoto lens will not be needed; however, if you do have a selection of lenses, we recommend you bring them (including long telephotos).
